

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **Why must clients be booked?**

The booking process is critical as it establishes the client as an inmate of the jail and as such, subject to the disciplinary process of the jail. It is also critical that clients sentenced to the program be ordered to begin the program immediately, which requires being remanded into custody immediately.

### **How long will I be on Inmate status?**

The original length of Inmate status is determined by the Judge and varies depending on several factors (i.e. criminal history, drinking/driving history, community stability, court orders, etc.).

### **Are payment arrangements possible?**

Clients are required to make monthly payments sufficient enough to have the total cost of the program paid in full at termination. Payment arrangements are available and need to be discussed with the Inmate/Outmate Case Manager.

### **What is a SleepTime Unit?**

SleepTime is a cost effective, non-invasive alcohol and drug monitoring system (24 hours a day/7 days a week). It detects alcohol and other substance use.

Positive readings from SleepTime require that a urine specimen be submitted. If positive, as confirmed by a toxicology laboratory, the cost is paid by the client.

### **How does the SleepTime Unit work?**

The unit, which has a similar design to a wristwatch, is worn on the client's wrist and monitors sleep patterns for possible alcohol or drug use.

#### REMEMBER,

\*alcohol and drug **effected** sleep

**AND**

\*alcohol and drug **free** sleep

\*can be clearly differentiated.

### **What is the "download" process?**

Clients report to the Golden Intervention Office every Monday and Thursday to have their SleepTime Units' data read and analyzed. A sleep pattern report is generated in 2-3 minutes. If drug or alcohol use is suspected, a urine specimen is required and tested for confirmation. If confirmed positive, the client may be subject to regression to Inmate status.

## **Inmate/Outmate Program**

### **Program Description**

The Inmate/Outmate Program is a 1 year sentence to Jefferson County Jail that provides a community-based sentencing option created to: (1) offer clients convicted of multiple DUI/DWAI offenses an alternative to incarceration and (2) allow the clients to remain in the community by providing a program of intense supervision and intensive substance abuse treatment.

Clients typically begin their sentence in jail on **Inmate status**. They then leave the jail on **Outmate status** and begin community-based supervision with an Intervention Case Manager.

If there are any violations of the Terms and Conditions of the program, the client may be returned to jail on Inmate status. After further review, the client may then be released to resume the community-based portion of the sentence.

## Client Information

\*The Inmate/Outmate Program is an intensive performance-based one-year program designed to give repeat DUI/DWAI clients a chance to remain in the community and work at changing their behavior.

\*Upon release from the Jefferson County Detention Facility, the client immediately reports to the Golden Intervention Office to begin the Intake process.

\*At Intake, clients will meet with their Case Manager, sign all Terms and Conditions of the Inmate/Outmate Program and be placed on a SleepTime Unit (24/7 substance abuse monitoring).

\*Participants live at home, are employed, able to provide support to their families, and successfully manage financial matters.

\*For the first 90 days of the program, clients are expected to attend weekly treatment groups. Clients who have begun treatment, through an ADAD approved agency, after the offense date and prior to sentencing, will receive credit for that treatment.

\*Treatment must be successfully completed to meet Department of Motor Vehicle requirements for license reinstatement.

\*Clients without a valid driver's license must make arrangements for transportation to all appointments.

\*Clients are required to report to the Golden Intervention Office, 17720 South Golden Road, Golden, CO., every Monday and Thursday, to have their SleepTime Units' data read and analyzed.

\*While in the program, clients are required to submit to random urine screens, meet with the Case Manager and participate in a community-based support group (AA/NA) twice per week.

\*The use of illegal or unauthorized drugs, including alcohol, is strictly forbidden in this program.

\*Failure to comply with the Terms and Conditions of the Inmate/Outmate Program can result in immediate regression (return) to the Jefferson County Detention Facility. The number of regressions and the severity of the violation will dictate the amount of time the client spends on Inmate status and further eligibility to continue in the program.

\*Violations may also result in termination from the program, requiring the remainder of the sentence to be served in custody.

**If clients have further questions, please ask the Alcohol Evaluator or the Judge.**

## Inmate/Outmate Fees

*Clients pay for their own supervision and treatment, with costs pro-rated over the length of the program in order to make costs more manageable.*

### **Phase I:**

\$13.50 per day for the first 90 days.

Fees include the treatment, case supervision contacts, treatment verification, SleepTime technology, and any required urine screens. Positive urine screens are paid for by the client.

### **Phase II:**

\*\$50 per month: face-to-face supervision contacts.

\*\$20.00: For each treatment group, twice a week.

\*\$6.50/day: SleepTime monitoring

\*Cost of Positive Urine Screens

### **Phase III:**

\*\$35 per month face-to-face supervision contacts.

\*\$20.00: For each treatment group, twice a week.

\*\$6.50/day: SleepTime monitoring

\*Cost of Positive Urine Screens

*Clients **may be** eligible for a sliding fee scale.*
