Administering Agency

C = courts & probation

D = detention/ jail / Sheriff's Department

E = Department of Health & Environment

H = Department of Human Services – Note: most programs administered through Human Services are provided and operated by an independent organization with

whom Jefferson County Human Services has contracted for services

L = law enforcement

M = mental health

N = non-profit company or charitable organization

P = private vendor

S = school – Note: There are no programs administered district wide. Individual Jefferson County schools assess their needs and choose appropriate programs.

Therefore, a program with “S” may serve a population as small as a single school.

Level of Evaluation and Effectiveness

Programs that have conducted their own evaluations and reported some measurable effectiveness are indicated with a dashed underscore i.e. program name.

Ten nationally recognized and well respected organizations have created lists of prevention programs that have been rigorously evaluated by independent researchers and have demonstrated effectiveness. Programs that have met standards of effectiveness of one or more of these organizations are indicated by a solid underscore, i.e. program name.
