Cell Phones for Seniors

A program of the Jefferson and Gilpin Counties Triad

The Jefferson County Triad is offering free 911 cell phones to seniors to use in case of an emergency.

Triad is a three-pronged partnership between prosecutors, law enforcement and the community working together to prevent the victimization seniors. The Cell Phone Project is one of many programs the Triad operates on behalf of older adults.

The phones collected by schools and Triad participants. They are given to the District Attorney's Office who has them deprogrammed and set to only make 911 calls in case of an emergency, such as a senior falling down in their home.

Students at Creighton Middle School students are among those helping seniors in need in the community by collecting old cell phones to be distributed in the community in case of an emergency.

Scott Storey, Jeffco District Attorney, created TRIAD for community groups and volunteer senior citizens to come together to develop and implement crime prevention and education programs for older adults.
