Choose a Healthy pregnancy

Sometimes pregnancy can be difficult.

The **Prenatal Plus Program** is a voluntary program to help you have a healthy pregnancy and a healthy baby.



You may qualify for this FREE service if you:

- ◆ Are on Medicaid or Presumptive Eligibility (PE)

If you are eligible, you and your family will receive:

- ◆ Support from a nurse, dietician, and counselor
- ◆ Home or office visits by staff trained to work with your special needs
- ◆ Help getting your Medicaid card
- ◆ Answers to your questions about pregnancy, labor and delivery and caring for your baby
- ◆ Information on resources in your community to help you and your baby
- ◆ Staff can spend time with you during your pregnancy and after, until your baby is two months old

Are you expecting your first child?

The **Nurse Family Partnership** is a voluntary program to help you and your child begin a healthy life together.



You may qualify for this FREE service if you:

- ◆ Are expecting your first child?
- ◆ Have a limited income?

If you are eligible, you and your family will receive:

- ◆ Home visits by specially trained nurses during your pregnancy and up to your child's second birthday
- ◆ Extensive one-on-one support from your nurse
- ◆ Information to help with your pregnancy and delivery
- ◆ Parenting information to help your child grow and be healthy
- ◆ Information on resources in the community to help meet your family's needs
