### **Rebecca E. Baker, C.B.O., Jefferson County Building Safety**

Ms. Baker, a Certified Building Official, is the Director of Building Safety for Jefferson County, where she oversees a staff of 37 performing 75,000 inspections annually. Prior to her current position, she was the Building Official for the City of Englewood, and has been in a building official position for 22 years. Ms. Baker is an Honorary Member of the ICC, was recently appointed to the ICC Ad Hoc Committee on Administrative Provision in the I-Codes, and has served on the National Board of Directors of ICBO. In addition to published work, she has received the Presidents Award from the Denver Metro Building Owners and Managers Association, in addition to receiving the Colorado Component of the American Institute of Architects Presidents Award.
