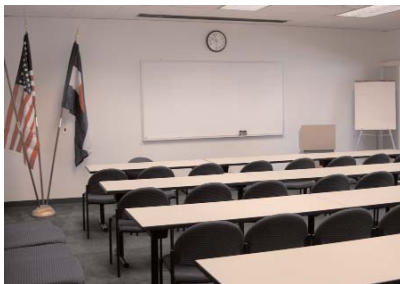
# South Precinct

The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office south precinct, located at **8100 Shaffer Pkwy, Suite 100**, makes Sheriff's Office services more accessible to more than half of Jefferson County's residents. The building, which opened in March 2005, is located near Ken-Caryl Avenue and C-470 in the Ken-Caryl Business Center. Business hours for the public are **8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday**.

More than 50 percent of unincorporated Jefferson County's residents live in the south part of the county, and an even greater percentage of patrol calls originate from south Jeffco. However, until the south precinct was established in March 2005, the only staffed Sheriff's Office locations were in Golden and Evergreen.

## Community Room

The south precinct location features a community room. This meeting space seats 60 and is available to local community groups for meetings. To inquire about the community room for your upcoming meeting, call 720-377-2001.

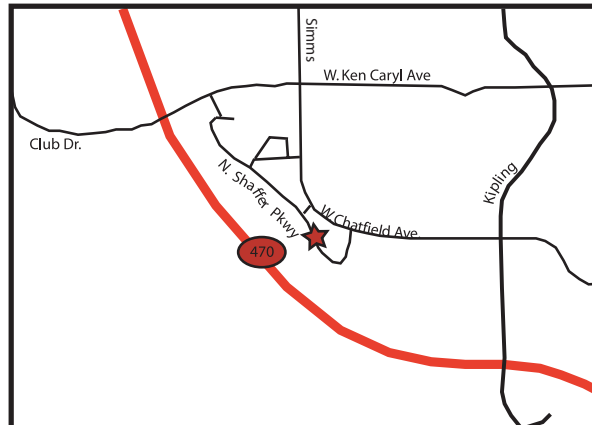

# Services Available

Citizens can do the following at the 8100 Shaffer Pkwy. location:

- Report a crime
- Get a copy of a police report
- VIN verification
- Fingerprinting (8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.)
- Request extra patrols or vacation checks
- Obtain a list of registered sex offenders
- Dog licensing
- Drop off a stray dog
- Obtain crime prevention and safety literature
- Meet with victim advocates
- Use the after-hours phone in an emergency

### Directions from C-470

Exit Ken Caryl Avenue east. Drive one block, then turn south (right) on Shaffer Parkway. The JCSO is located in Suite 100 of the Ken Caryl Business Center at 8100 Shaffer Pkwy.

Look for the brick building with green awning on the east side of Shaffer Parkway. Suite 100 is the southern part of the building directly facing the road.
