They partner with health care facilities throughout the state and targets non-dependent drug users.

Their services include outpatient care, inpatient/residential treatment, DUI education in several languages, and detoxification. Cessation coaching includes assistance with medication to help people quit. This is a free resource for Coloradans. To receive the phone coaching support you must be 18 or older. Younger callers can get help with tobacco-related information and referrals to youth-focused resources. Providers can refer people to the Colorado Quitline using a fax referral form available at their website coquitline.org.</p>
