




SMART Jeffco Activity




Mental Health

In response to the rising number of mental health service calls in unincorporated Jefferson County, the JCSO is working on a mental health, multi-discipline partnership between the Jefferson Center for Mental Health, the District Attorney's Office, Probation and Human Services.

The objective of this group is to collectively address problematic citizens in our community who suffer with mental health issues. Professional collaboration helps to identify resolution and resources to those afflicted, and their families.

The ultimate goal is to proactively track and address mental health issues in our community.



In 2013, 588 mental health service calls were received and 597 reports were written for mental health.





M1 Holds

Usually the family calls the police due to concerns about a person's safety. If the deputy observes that the person is in imminent danger of harming themselves or another, or is "gravely disabled" the officer can recommend a hold and transport the person to the emergency room. When a person who is exhibiting severe symptoms of mental illness arrives at the emergency room, it is often by virtue of a "mental health hold" (M1 Hold).

JCSO has over 160 Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) members. These deputies receive specialty training and are called upon to react appropriately to situations involving highly stressed individuals, mentally ill, developmentally disabled, and suicidal subjects. Specialty training provides certification to respond to highly stressed individuals. The CIT deputies have direct interaction with those afflicted. These deputies also serve as advocates for the families and caregivers.



Unattended Deaths

Deputies routinely respond to death reports. When the death is deemed an 'unattended death' the Crimes Against Persons Unit of the Investigations Division is called to investigate.

'Unattended death' is a term for a person who has not been seen by a physician within 3 days immediately prior to the date of death. The Criminalistics Unit is dually responsible in supplying crime scene response and processing, forensic photography, and latent print comparison. A thorough investigation is performed on all homicide, suicide, accidental or natural deaths.



Investigators respond to unattended deaths

Deputies respond to all reports of death.

Unattended Deaths

In January, the Investigations Division investigated 22 death cases; 18 were of natural causes, 3 were suicides, 1 death was undetermined.

In February, 16 cases were investigated; 14 were deemed to be of natural causes, 1 death was determined accidental.

In March, 16 death cases were investigated; 2 were suicides, 1 homicide, and 13 were deemed natural causes.

Victim Services Volunteers

In the first quarter of 2014, 17 volunteers donated 1157.5 volunteer hours saving JCSO \$23,150 based on an average victim advocate salary of \$20 an hour.

Motor Vehicle Trespass


Two suspects were arrested on Jan. 16 for 1st degree criminal trespass. These arrests cleared multiple open cases.


Burglaries

The Property Crimes Unit investigated 122 burglaries in the first quarter of 2014.





2009 - 2013**




Motor Vehicle Theft

CAC Unit

The Investigations Division features a distinct unit, which gives special attention to child victims of abuse and sexual assault. The Crimes Against Children Unit works with child victims and their non-offending parents or guardians. Child victims receive direct support and sympathetic assistance throughout the criminal justice process.



Crimes Against Children

71 cases involving crimes against children were investigated in the first quarter of 2014.

Case Closure Stats

In January, the Crimes Against Children Unit investigated 25 cases; 6 were administratively cleared and 19 were cleared by way of arrest. In February, 28 cases were investigated; 2 administratively cleared, and 11 were cleared by way of arrest. In March, 18 cases were investigated; 9 administratively cleared, and 9 were cleared by way of arrest.

Database

The Investigations Division maintains the registered sex offender database for those in unincorporated Jeffco only. A complete list of all unincorporated Jeffco registered sex offenders is available at all sheriff's office locations.


