Lookout Mountain Crime Spree Halted

On July 23rd, a deputy patrolling on Lookout Mountain initiated a traffic stop on a white Ford Crown Victoria that resembled an unmarked police car. The car was driven by an adult male, later identified as Christopher Sullivan, and a juvenile female passenger. When the deputy returned to his patrol car to do a records check, Sullivan and the juvenile fled the scene in the vehicle. Deputies, CSP, and Golden PD initiated a search of the mountain side looking for the suspects.


A short time later Sullivan and the juvenile began a two-hour crime spree. In their attempt to elude law enforcement, the suspects stole three vehicles, burglarized two homes, menaced 12 bystanders and left six separate crime scenes for processing. Amidst the spree a lieutenant shot at the suspect after he pointed a rifle in his direction. Meanwhile, a news helicopter began offering visuals of the suspect's whereabouts. The suspect was attempting to car-jack several vehicles on I-70 armed with a high powered rifle when a deputy arrived on his motorcycle. Sullivan was apprehended by the deputy who successfully maneuvered the motorcycle, holstered his weapon, and arrested the suspect without further harm to the community.

The juvenile surrendered herself to a deputy. Investigations filed over 50 criminal charges against the suspect.

→ "I am the mother of the man you arrested on Lookout Mt. last Wednesday. I wanted to thank you for not shooting him in an incredible stressful situation. You showed great restraint and you are a true professional. If it had been someone else it may have ended quite differently. I also thank all the other officers who showed restraint against my son. My heart is broken but my son is alive today because of you. I hope that someday his children will be able to sit across the table from him and share stories of their childhood with him. He is greatly loved and we hope he gets the help he desperately needs. On behalf of the family we thank you again."

Fraud Line

Sheriff's Office investigators often work with the fraud units of major financial institutions and credit card companies to track down identity thieves. With a nationwide increase in frauds, JCSO is streamlining its approach with the use of a Fraud Reporting Hotline that was unveiled in January.

Fraud and Deceit

King Soopers pharmacy contacted the Sheriff's Office to report that a customer was attempting to pass a fraudulent prescription. Deputies responded and determined that the prescription had been altered. The arrest was made after a doctor confirmed a prescription had not been ordered.

'Hit Man Scam' Returns

The 'Hit Man Scam' returned after an eight year hiatus. Investigators are receiving an influx of reports of this scam on the hotline. In this scam, the victim receives an email from an alleged hit man who claims to have people monitoring the victim's every move until the day of 'assassination'. The email warns not to report the threat and demands a monetary buy-off.

Elder Abuse

Recently passed elder abuse legislation has created mandatory reporting laws. The deputies and Investigations Division have been trained to respond to reports of elder abuse.

Elder Abuse Conviction

On August 20th, a Jefferson County jury convicted Roger Tomasek, of Highlands Ranch, for stealing from his in-laws.

Within days of being named the power of attorney for his in-laws, Tomasek and his wife, Sheila, began a spending spree.

In one year, \$272,000 was withdrawn from savings accounts. When Sheila's brother became suspicious of the purchases, Roger Tomasek promptly sought a protection order against the brother in-law. Tomasek proceeded to change locks and security codes with the intent to block the brother's access to his elderly parents.

After the elderly father passed away the Tomasek's cashed in the life insurance policy. The 90 year-old wife was not given access to the funds and became \$42,000 in debt to her presiding caregivers.

Investigators testified that a majority of the funds were directly tracked to luxury improvements to the Tomasek's home, a diamond ring, personal trainers, massages, botox and trips to Las Vegas. Sheila Tomasek was sentenced to ten years in prison. Roger Tomasek's sentencing will be held in October of 2014.



Unattended Deaths

Deputies routinely respond to death reports. When the death is deemed an 'unattended death' the Crimes Against Persons Unit of the Investigations Division is called to investigate. 'Unattended death' is a term for a person who has not been seen by a physician within 3 days immediately prior to the date of death. The Criminalistics Unit is dually responsible in supplying crime scene response and processing, forensic photography, and latent print comparison. A thorough investigation is performed on all homicide, suicide, accidental or suspicious deaths.



Death Investigations

In the 3rd quarter of 2014, 56 death investigations were conducted by the Crimes Against Persons Unit.

Investigations responded to a 60-year-old male found in Leyden Creek Park with a self inflicted gunshot wound. The male had recently been indicted by the Attorney General's Office on theft charges. His trial was set to begin the day he was found. He was transported to the hospital and died of his injuries.

A 30-year-old male was reported unconscious by roommates. Investigators arrived to secure and examine the scene. A syringe, spoon, lighter and a brown substance was located in proximity to the body. Medical personnel attempted to revive the male for 30 minutes before he was pronounced deceased. Two witnesses in the apartment were interviewed thoroughly and were dismissed as suspects. The death was deemed accidental.

A 49-year-old male was found deceased by his wife. Investigators gathered that he had no known medical issues, but was a lifelong cigarette smoker of one or more packs a day. Two months prior he quit drinking. No suspicious circumstances were found, he lived with his wife and had not seen a doctor in many years. The death was deemed natural.

Victim Services Volunteers

In the 3rd quarter of 2014, volunteers donated 1,060 direct service and duty hours; saving JCSO \$21,210 based on an average victim advocate salary of \$20 an hour.

Victim Services

The Victim Services Unit responds to both primary and secondary victims of cases that fall under the crime victim rights amendment. Primary victims are those directly affected by the crime whereas secondary victims can be family members, or other witnesses. Often, they receive community referrals, and other services.

Motor Vehicle Trespass

In the 3rd quarter of 2014, **148** first degree trespasses to motor vehicles occurred.



Keene Trespasses


The Sheriff's Office received over twenty reports of vehicles trespassed in the Keene neighborhood (US Hwy 285 and S. Kipling in south Jeffco). In all but one of the cases the vehicles were unlocked. Investigators pursued leads and made an arrest in this case in September.

Arrest - Trespass in Progress

On July 31st, deputies established a perimeter in the 9100 block of West Radcliffe Drive in south Jeffco after they received information that a motor vehicle trespass suspect was hiding in a backyard. The suspect was contacted while walking in the area. He denied trespassing the vehicles, but evidence found in his backpack revealed otherwise. An arrest was made without incident.

Arrest - Trespass in Progress

On July 10th, deputies contacted a male who matched the description of a suspect who had trespassed motor vehicles in the area of the 11300 block of Tanforan Circle. The victims positively identified the male as the suspect. He was jailed for motor vehicle trespass, burglary and probation violations.




Burglaries

Motor Vehicle Theft


Thirty-eight cases of motor vehicle theft were investigated in the 3rd quarter of 2014. Ten stolen vehicles were recovered by investigators in the same quarter.



Attempted Theft

In July, a victim called the Sheriff's Office with a visual of an unknown male sitting in his drivers seat. The suspect was arrested for trespassing two vehicles.

CAC Unit

The Investigations Division features a distinct unit, which gives special attention to child victims of abuse and sexual assault. The Crimes Against Children Unit works with child victims and their non-offending parents or guardians. Child victims receive direct support and sympathetic assistance throughout the criminal justice process.



Crimes Against Children

September indicates a seasonal spike for case closures attributed to 18 runaway cases cleared and an arrest for 20 trespasses to motor vehicles.

Case Closure Stats

In **July**, the Crimes Against Children Unit received 20 new cases to investigate. A total of 43 cases were cleared in the month.

In **August**, the Crimes Against Children Unit received 49 new cases to investigate. A total of 27 cases were cleared in the month.

In **September**, the Crimes Against Children Unit received 54 new cases to investigate. A total of 98 cases were cleared in the month.

Sexually Violent Predator Meeting

The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office hosted a community notification meeting in July regarding the residency of a Sexually Violent Predator. Gerald Hurley was released from custody in July after serving a seven month sentence for a parole violation associated with a previous sexual assault. Upon release Hurley indicated he might be residing in unincorporated Jefferson County.

The three-hour community meeting educated the public, and enhanced public safety. There were over 90 attendees. JCSO was represented by five victim advocates, a sex offender specialist, five investigators, a deputy, a public information officer, a lieutenant, chief, captain, the undersheriff and sheriff. Sex offenders are required by law to notify law enforcement of their residence. Law enforcement is authorized to share information with members of the affected community.




