Roll Offs & Dumpster Guidelines

General Information:

- No permits are required for dumpster, roll-offs or other containers placed on your property.
- If the container is placed in public right-of-way (sidewalks, public alleys or streets) a permit is necessary.
Note: Permits are not required when containers are associated with construction projects that are part of a larger common plan of development.
- Permits may be obtained by the container company, the property owner, or the person responsible for filling the container.
- Containers are generally not allowed on arterial or collector streets.

Safe Practices

- Containers should be placed at least 20 feet from any street corner, ramp, alley or entrance and fit near the roadway edge or curb.
- Placement of an orange cone behind the container is encouraged to warn approaching vehicles of the obstruction in the street.
- Containers should not leak, overflow or be filled such that debris can fall into the roadway or blow away. The applicant will be responsible all cleanup expenses if pollutants are found to be discharging into the waterways / storm sewer, as well as damages to the roadway.
