<b>General</b>	Family: Pink (Caryophyllaceae) Introduced from Europe as an ornamental Colorado List B - Control required
<b>Common names</b>	Soapwort, Sweet William
<b>Habitat</b>	Perennial forb Colony forming Found in wet areas, roadsides, disturbed areas
PLANT	
<b>Vegetation</b>	Plant to 3 feet tall Leaves ½-1 inch wide and 2-4 inches long Opposite with 3 veins from base
<b>Roots</b>	Rhizome Spreading
<b>Flower</b>	July-Sept. White to pink Dense groups at end of branches ½ - 1 inch wide 5 petals, slightly notched
<b>Seed</b>	Many
<b>Seedling</b>	Late spring
<b>Reproduction</b>	Seed Rhizomes
